

## Coordinator

When a plan is drawn up, a coordinator is appointed. A coordinator is a person who works for the local authority or county council.

It could be someone you have been in contact with on a regular basis or someone you trust very much. If you wish, you can suggest that a particular person acts as your coordinator.

The task of a coordinator is to ensure that you receive a Coordinated Individual Plan and that the plan is followed up.

A coordinator acts as a link between you and the staff at the various care, support and welfare providers.

## Coordinated Individual Plan

A Coordinated Individual Plan is used to coordinate the help you are receiving from different care, support and welfare providers.

The plan improves harmonisation and provides a complete picture for you and those close to you as well as your care, support and welfare providers. It allows you to exert greater influence and ensures that you are more involved in matters related to your situation.

## How it works

You and the staff – from the local authority or county council for example – work together to see which care, support and welfare providers you have around you.

It is the duty of the staff to bring all these parties together for a coordination meeting.

The meeting can take different forms and the participants work together to find a solution that is best for you.

Before the meeting takes place it would be good if you could think through your present situation.

- What are your needs, wishes and expectations?
- What would be your ideal situation?

During the meeting, you discuss your needs as well as the responsibilities of the care, support and welfare providers. The resulting information is then compiled into a Coordinated Individual Plan, which will be presented to you.
